This Month's Deals!

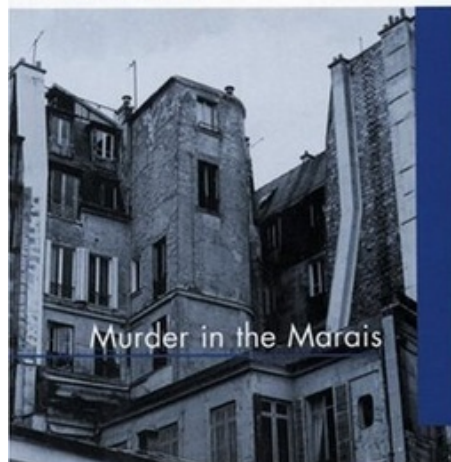
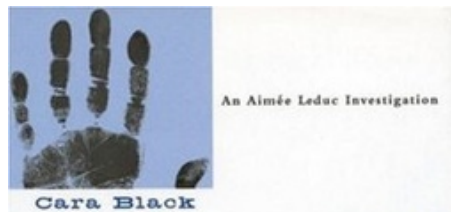
